

We had helped the prior owners of this house make it a home of *their* dreams, now we got to help Abby and Randy do the same.



Custom Office

We had some challenges in the office, mainly a double entry door, a large shuttered window, as well as a vintage embossed desk, and a large dark bookcase, all in a room 10' by 13'.

The Greene's wanted to use the inherited bookcases above, but wanted a more contemporary look/feel for the room. So, we designed the desk and credenza with a complimentary look, but more contemporary feel.


We designed the file storage credenza and desk in alder with a cherry stain. The front of the desk holds books, allowing the desk to be deeper on top for laptop, monitor, and working materials.

We added two bookcases on each end of the credenza that were painted the color of the wall, so they wouldn't over power the room.

Music Room

Randy loves music!!! So Sara and I created a *proper* music room by covering the walls with 2 ft. by 8 ft. linen panels, including the closet door, and back side of the door to the room; all for proper acoustics. The panels are attached to the walls with Velcro strips, shown in the picture to the right.

The drapes are double lined in same fabric.

Then we designed the cabinet/seating piece which is shown above 90° from the sofa, and below during construction. The drawers store vinyl albums (remember them), as well as CDs in the small center drawer. We padded the top, for additional seating, when several couples listen together.





Our Audio expert assisted in the balance of the decibels, to ensure the experience is what they wanted. It is a beautiful room. The horizontal LED lights resemble the front of an audio receiver, alternating height in the room.

Randy loves his new music room and very much appreciates the unique ways we helped him accomplish his dream music room.
